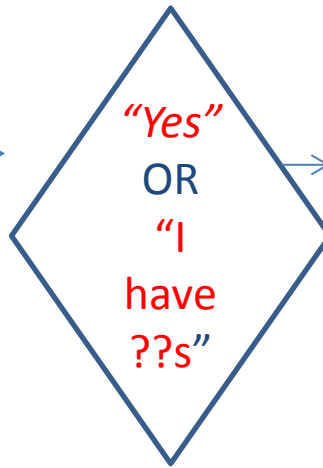


EXAMPLE: HPV Cancer Prevention Plan Postcard Workflow

**Prepare Chart
One Day Prior to
Patient Visit**

Medical Records

- Check Health Visit scheduled for 9 yrs and older
- Check if patient has started the HPV series
- If no, write patient name on post-card
- Place card in accordion file A-Z for Front Staff

Front Staff

- Hand Postcard to Parent on Clipboard
- Request Complete it to give to MA

Medical Assistant

- Receive card from parent



**MD Visit
with Patient**

- MD**
- Discuss the HPV vaccine with patient/parent

Medical Assistant

- Place postcard on door for doctor to review

MD

- Discuss the HPV vaccine with patient/parent
- If parent elects to vaccinate, complete orders

Medical Assistant

- Place completed card in folder in MA Station
- Follow-up data review of *decline/received* for each response type

SAFETY: Since 2006, over 178 million doses have been given worldwide and there has been no pattern of dangerous side effects.

COMMON SIDE EFFECTS: Pain, redness, and soreness at the injection site, tiredness. Sometimes pre-teens and teens faint after vaccinations. Your child should rest for 15 minutes after the injection to avoid fainting.

NOTES:
